Drosophila is a genus of small flies, belonging to the family Drosophilidae, whose members are often called "fruit flies" or pomace flies, vinegar flies, or wine flies, a reference to the characteristic of many species to linger around overripe or rotting fruit. One species of *Drosophila* in particular, *D. melanogaster*, has been heavily used in research in genetics and is a common model organism in developmental biology.
