Congenital disorder is the abnormality of structure and function of the human body arising during development. The incidence is 2~5% in newborn. Genetic abnormalities, the intrauterine (uterus) environment, errors of morphogenesis, infection, or a chromosomal abnormality may cause congenital disorder. The outcome of the disorder will depend on complex interactions between the pre-natal deficit and the post-natal environment. Although prenatal diagnosis (screening) can be used to detect some disorders before birth, more need to be discussed on **congenital disorder**.
