COVID-19, also known as 2019-nCoV acute respiratory disease and novel coronavirus pneumonia (NCP), is an infectious disease caused by the 2019 novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2). It was first detected during the 2019–20 Wuhan coronavirus outbreak. It results in flu-like symptoms, including fever, coughing, shortness of breath, pain in the muscles and tiredness. It may result in pneumonia, acute respiratory distress syndrome, sepsis and septic shock, and possible death. The outbreak was declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern in January 2020 and a pandemic in March 2020.

In this special issue, we intend to invite front-line researchers and authors to submit original research and review articles on **COVID-19 and Public Health**. Potential topics include, but are not limited to:
