Call for Papers

Neuro-Infectious diseases are infections that affect the central and peripheral nervous system, as well as persons with meningitis of unknown etiology and post-viral neurologic diseases. It includes the vast neurological complications of an array of infectious agents such as bacteria, viruses, fungi and parasites. Neuro-Infectious diseases typically result when the body's immune system is unable to fight off an invading pathogen or germ. The goal of this special issue is to provide a platform for scientists and academicians all over the world to promote, share, and discuss various new issues and developments in the area of Neuro-Infectious diseases.

In this special issue, we intend to invite front-line researchers and authors to submit original research and review articles on exploring **Neuro-Infectious Diseases**. Potential topics include, but are not limited to:

- Neurological complications of HIV (including encephalopathy, neuropathy, progressive multifocal leukoencephalopathy, toxoplasmosis, primary CNS lymphoma, cryptococcal meningitis)
- Acute bacterial meningitis
- Viral encephalitis (including HSV, VZV, and others)
- Parasitic infections of the brain and spinal cord
- Prion diseases
- Bacterial infections such as Lyme disease, tuberculosis
- Syphilis of the nervous system
- Brain abscess
- Infections of the spinal cord (myelitis)
- Recurrent aseptic meningitis
- Neurological infections in transplant patients
